	Currently updating Comprehensive Plan and Critical Areas Ordinance (CAO). SMP is required to be consistent with the Comp Plan. Comprehensive Plan is due in December so team is focusing on that.	
	Significant elements with this periodic update:  • A climate element has been added to the plan	
	<ul> <li>A new rule preventing urban growth areas from encroaching into resource lands. It's necessary to adopt these policies before they can finalize the CAO and the SMP.</li> </ul>	
	It's unclear how these policy changes will affect the final SMP but it makes sense to do things in this order. Comp. Plan affects the CAO & SMP.	
	<ul> <li>Staff anticipates completing it by end of October.</li> <li>Heidi wants everyone to be clear on the causes delays at this point (Comp. Plan &amp; Critical Areas Ordinance).</li> </ul>

OTHER MRC PROJECTS	Other MRC Projects  DEI UPDATES (Emily)	

At the August meeting, Emily reviewed the recommendations of the DEI subcommittee.

- Revising the format of the monthly meetings
- Encourage more public engagement
- Increasing flow to allow for time to discuss topics they are excited about.
- Feedback from the August meeting was compiled and Emily sent it out via email. She also passed printed copies to the
  room.

DEI consulting contract is ending this month.

- Emily's understanding is that the work of changing the monthly meeting structure will move from the DEI subcommittee to the Executive committee.
  - Focus is to slowly implement the changes into future monthly meetings. Feedback will be necessary as they test these changes.
- She noted that today's meeting was an example of efficient reporting of updates.
- She'll give prompts of what an efficient update looks like
  - o Subcommittee discussion
  - o Implementation
  - o Reiteration
  - Adaptive Management
- Betsy asked if the "what we do" MRC blurb could be added to the agenda.
- Emily said we may want to adapt it ourselves---it's a work-inprogress.

Betsy asked who will keep track of the Youth Representative if there is no DEI committee.

- Discussion followed on how to support the potential candidates and the process involved with recruitment and acceptance of the position.
- Interested candidates should send an email or Letter of Interest to Katie.

### SATELLITE IMAGERY (Jeff)

Jeff showed a slide presentation in conjunction with this discussion.

North Beach and McCurdy Point are areas closely monitored for Kelp, but the section between those two areas isn't being looked at.

- Glass Beach we call it Area 2: They discovered this area has been in serious decline for the past six years.
- Chris & Jeff were curious about the inconsistency between MRC & DNR data.
  - DNR is using perimeter monitoring, which looks at the perimeter and bed size. Doesn't take density into account.
  - We've been looking at density but it's difficult to get a good measurement of that. (It's objective, not qualitative)
- NWSC's Ken Collins, did some diving surveys.
- It maps what is really there, and when he went to the middle, there was nothing there.
- He believes the kelp isn't behaving the way people think it is.

Jeff would like to continue this project and begin looking at data like this.

He proposes restarting this as a non-grant funded project.

- Gordon asked if others were already doing this.
- Jeff reiterated that this is different. All of the other papers he
  has seen are getting measurements off of Satellite imagery.
  This would be looking for trends. It's worthwhile so they can
  know where to look and find a signal that's different.
- Emily noted that this is an excellent project. She was curious for more information of why this should be an official MRC project. What's the decision criteria?
  - A broader discussion than just this project.

	<ul> <li>Jeff has been discussing this with Jeff Whitty of NWSC one key component is "buy-in" with local groups (i.eJefferson County should be interested in the county's Kelp).</li> <li>There was discussion that this goes along with the MRC's mission as an advisory board to the Jefferson Co. Commissioners.</li> <li>The "ask" is for this to be a non-grant funded project, but it needs to be official so it can potentially be fed into SoundlQ and Jeff can tap into the Science Advisory Committee.</li> <li>Brenda questioned how this was different from the project proposed one year ago.</li> <li>Gordon noted one difference was that the last time, they were trying to shift money into it, which turned out to be a major problem. But that's not an issue now and that's why he supports it.</li> <li>Katie added that we should put boundaries on it, like they do with all MRC projects.</li> </ul>	Betsy motioned that the MRC accept this project: Jeff will regularly share the information with MRC and the MRC will post pertinent information (data after outside validation) on the website.  MRC voting members raised their hands for approval. No opposed. Motion passed.
