GUEST SPEAKER Darby Flanagan- Abalone Biologist WDFW WA Dept of Fish & Wildlife	Pinto Abalone Restoration in Washington State Species Introduction Gastropod mollusk or a Snail Pinto Abalone are found from SW AK to Baja Mexico Locally in the Straits of Juan de Fuca & San Juan Islands Can live up to 30 years Prefer near shore, rocky reef habitat, close to kelp beds Diet is Kelp and diatoms Very important to the ecosystem. Broadcast spawners Fertilization occurs outside of the body Population is in active decline Historical Overview Pinto Abalone were an important food source for local first nations.		

- Peak take years were 1960-1990
- 1980s took 400K Abalone from WA per year (number only counts the legal take)
- Immeasurable numbers taken from poaching
- 1990s Population decline in Northern range: WA & Canada fisheries close
- 1992 WA set up 10 index monitoring stations
- 1998 WA designates PA as a state candidate Species
- 1999 Canada lists PA as a threatened species
- 2004 NOAA lists as Federal Species of Concern
- 2009 PA increased to endangered species
- 2019 WA State lists PA under State Endangered Species list

Current Population Status

- 97% decline from 1992 2017
- They do not meet the presumed min. density for fertilization
- Two years too late shutting down the abalone fisheries
- Shell length is getting bigger meaning that the population is aging out
- Reproductive collapse due to low adult densities

Research/Recovery Program

Goal is to create a self-sustaining network of reproductive population in WA

WDFW + Puget Sound Restoration Fund + collaborators

- Working together to produce raise and outplant captive bred Abalone
- Abalone collection without harming them
 Place in a captive breeding program
- 3. In Manchester, WA near Bremerton
- 4. More than 55k Abalone outplanted in wild
- 5. Representing over 250 genetically distinct families
- 6. Other satellite facilities: Seattle Aquarium (full program) and PT Marine Science Center (storage only)

Outplants

WDF + PSRF established 36 sites in San Juan Islands since 2009

- Currently outplanting mixed cohorts of 1yr & 2yr
- 2009 2016 tagged every individual Abalone
- Species has a naturally high mortality
 - o 1 yr olds: 1% survival....is "good enough"
 - 2 yr olds: 4% survival....is "good enough"

Reassess & Replace

- We stop outplanting to sites with 1st year observed less than 4 %
- Continue to overseed exited sites to maintain densities and increase genetic diversity
- Establish new sites
- Last survey showed an increase in population
 - 2024 were 13
 - 2017 were 12
 - 23 if you include the perimeter surveys

In the Works

- New sites
- Overseeding old sites
- Expanding Pinto restoration in the Strait
- New index stations
- New hatchery on Marrowstone

DEI Consultant Contract (special agenda topic Jeff & Chris)

- Kelp at North Beach is disappearing.
- \$12k is available in the budget until the end of June.
- A quality assurance plan needs to be written by the end of June
- MRC has to vote tonight if the funds will be used.
 Depends on what they learn as Chris starts exploring what's available.

NORTHSHORE KELP AREAS

- Area 1 & Area 5 look stable –lower priority
- Area 2 sparse area
- Focusing on Area 3 (area west of sewage outfall pipe)
 & 4 (sewage pipe)

Changes since 2016 - 2022

- Showed map of aerial photography with infrared imagery provided by DNR
- Marked decline in kelp density in areas 3 & 4
- Taken during same month from year to year
- Haven't released 2023 data

Satellite data:

- Same density in 2016-17
- Chris would like better data with higher resolution
- Need a paid account for that
- They contact Skywatch, a commercial satellite imagery company

Recommendations:

- 22 km view goes all the way from Point Hudson to Beckett Point
- \$750 per shot
- Archived images are less expensive
- They can get 3 years worth of data for \$5k, however, they aren't sure what's in the archive
- Chris showed examples of resolution

Funds would come out of two grant money projects:

- 6K ROV project supporting the students and
- 12K for a sonar scan survey. It's grant money.
